

REMARKS BY THE DEPUTY CHAIRPERSON OF HRD COUNCIL, AT THE 4th HUMAN RESOURCE

DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL SUMMIT 2021

Good morning, my name is Bheki Ntshalintshali, Deputy Chairperson of the HRD Council. It my privilege and singular honour to welcome you all to this 4th Human Resource Development Council (HRDC) Summit 2021. Firstly, let me acknowledge the role played by Women in the education and development of our nation during this women month.
